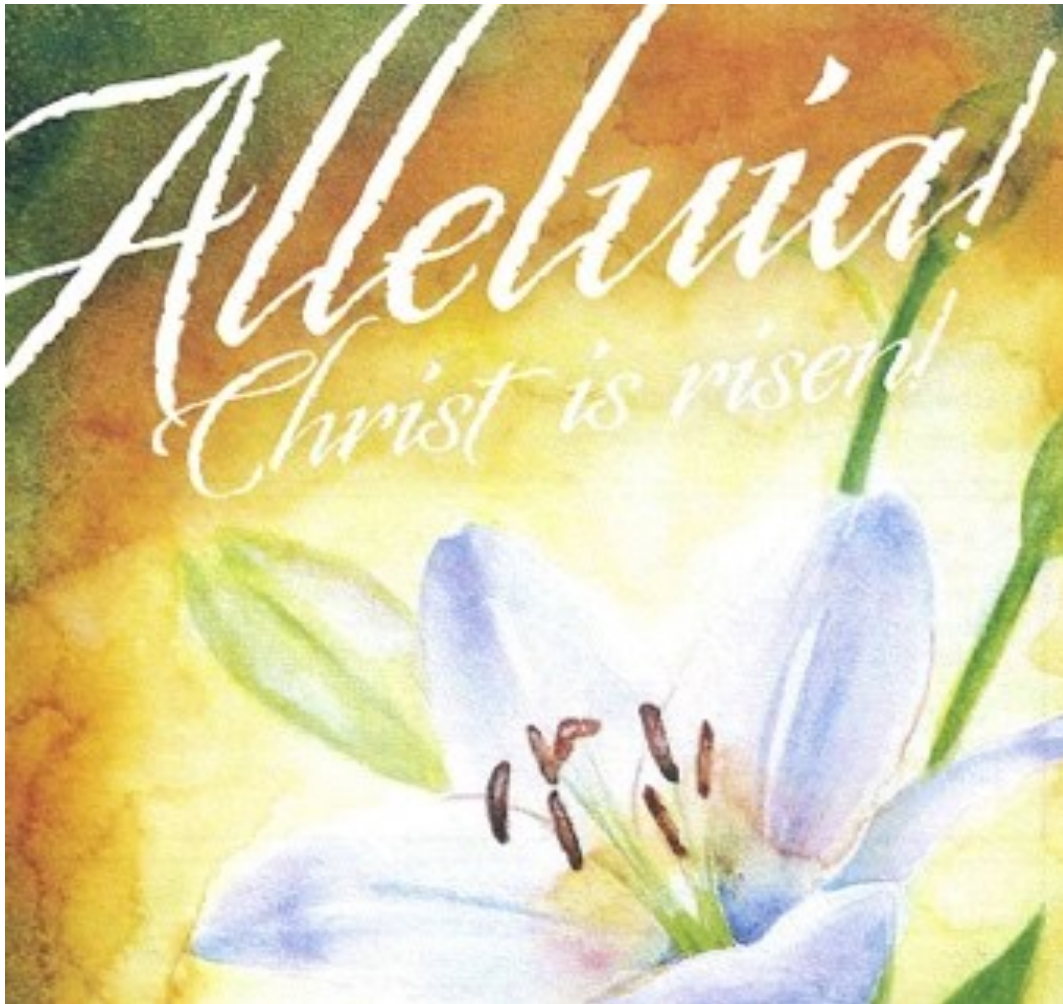

Easter Acclamation (said three times)

Celebrant: Alleluia. Christ is risen.

People: **The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

Make a joyful noise – ringing of bells, banging of pans, etc.
