

# Rector's Essay Church Means "NoThing" and Everything, by Grant Proctor - continued

We are overwhelmed constantly with things. Things that only matter on the surface, or only mean something for the blink of an eye.

Church, for me, means nothing or, better put, 'no thing.'

Here, in church we are:

- 1. Free from distraction and judgment
- 2. Without pressure to meet a false or pointless goal
- 3. Loved
- 4. Safe
- 5. At Peace

God welcomes all - no strings attached - here where there are no things. Here, where there are no things to distract, we can be still, faithful, and be at home in God's grace. By having 'no things,' church means everything!
