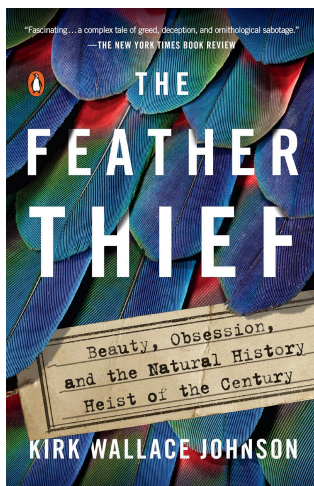

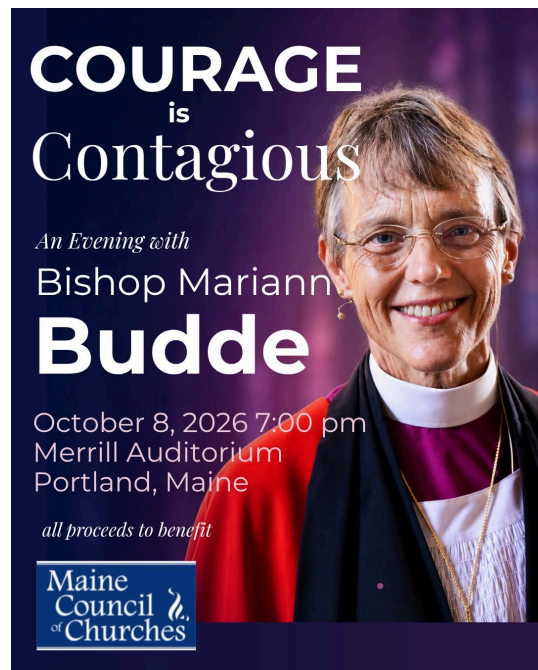


Women's Book Group
